So much to celebrate

Pride is something we all need to be careful about. It is regarded as one of the 'seven deadly sins' and it is often said that 'Pride comes before a fall'. John Ruskin captured that thought when he said that 'Pride is at the bottom of all great mistakes'. And that is probably true. Misplaced pride, over-exaggerated pride, egotistical pride probably does lie behind the great tragedies of human history. Wars are often fought because pride is involved somewhere. And as we know to our own cost, pride can seriously affect and undermine the relationships we have with friends and family.

But pride may not always be bad. Writers and philosophers have at times tried to distinguish between 'good pride' and 'bad pride'. And whilst it may not be possible to differentiate completely between them, I think we have a sense of what 'good pride' looks like. And 11 May is a day to celebrate 'good pride', for that is Somerset Day. It was chosen, because on 11 May 878AD King Alfred the Great roused the people of Somerset to fight and subsequently defeat the invading Viking army. And whilst people argue about whether or not he can be regarded as the first true King of England, he is the only English monarch to be accorded the title "the Great".

I think I am right in saying that Somerset was the third largest county in England although the original county boundary now includes other local authorities. Somerset Day however celebrates all that is good about the wonderful county of Somerset. It seeks to give Somerset more identity and is an occasion for all of us who live here to give thanks for the beauty and diversity which we sometimes take for granted. It is too easy to drive through villages and towns, through the stunning landscapes which come alive in different seasons and to fail to thank God for the gifts of his creation all around us.

On Somerset Day let's make an effort to pray for our local communities and those who serve us in every walk of life. There is so much to celebrate, so much to thank God for and so much to be proud of.

From the Organ Bench

I think I'd rather like to be a one-hit wonder – to write a book, or a piece of music, that becomes known to all, but then to write nothing else, ever. But one-hit wonders may also be people who have written a lot, but are famous only for one thing. That's much less satisfying.

The words of the great Ascension hymn *All hail the power of Jesu's name* were written by someone in the second category, but the composers of each of the two tunes associated with it seem to be firmly in the first.

Edward Perronet (1721-92), the son of an Anglican vicar who became one of the early supporters of Methodism, seems to have been something of a rebel. He studied at Cambridge but left without taking a degree; he became a travelling preacher with the early Methodists but then resigned and set up an independent chapel in Canterbury. He may have mellowed towards the end of his life, as he is buried in the cloisters of Canterbury Cathedral.

Perronet published three collections of hymns, but *All hail* is the only one which has passed the test of time. He was determined to do his rhyming the hard way, with each verse ending with the same words: but his robust, 18th century enthusiasm comes through in each verse, as here:

*All hail the power of Jesu's name! Let angels prostrate fall;
Bring forth the royal diadem To crown him Lord of all.
Crown him, ye morning stars of light, Who fixed this floating ball;
Now hail the strength of Israel's might, And crown him Lord of all.....*

....ending with an echo of the glorious final verse of Psalm 150 ('Let everything that hath breath praise the Lord'):

*Let every tribe, and every tongue, That bound creation's call,
Now shout in universal song, The crownèd Lord of all!*

Even so, *All hail* might never have found fame without the two fine, strong tunes to which it's sung. The one that most C of E congregations use is called *Miles Lane* and was written by William Shrubsole (1760-1806) who, despite writing this tune at the age of 19 and becoming organist of Bangor Cathedral in North Wales at 22, seems to have written nothing else. But the one he wrote was considered by both Edward Elgar and Ralph Vaughan Williams as one of the finest of all hymn tunes.

Braver hearts are needed to sing *Diadem*, preferably led by a choir: even then, people can't work out whether to sing the long quaver runs with the ladies or the short, sharp *Crown him*s with the men. It was composed by James Ellor (1819-99), an obscure Lancashire hat-maker, who like Shrubsole flowered early, became a chapel organist at the age of 18, wrote this tune at 19.... and then went back to making hats. But what a tune.

At the nearest Evensong to Ascension Day at St. Lawrence's, we'll sing *All hail* to *Miles Lane* and I'll play *Diadem* as the closing voluntary, so that you can see how lucky Edward Perronet was with both of his one-hit composers.

Praying for others to know Jesus is one of the most powerful things we can do. Persistent prayer for others brings transformation to their lives.

Pray for Five:

Choose five people you would regularly like to pray for and list their names. If you're not sure who, ask God to guide you as you choose. Once you have settled on 5 names, commit to praying for them regularly. You could use the following simple prayer:

Lord, I pray that you will lead ... to you.

Thank you that you love them.

I pray that you would break into their life and show them your love, grace and peace for them. Thank you. Amen.

You could use the BLESS acrostic below as an easy way to pray for the needs of your 5:

Reminders to Pray:

1. **Piece of String:** Tie five knots in a piece of string to represent the five people you have committed to pray for. Tie it round your wrist or place it somewhere that you'll see it regularly.
2. **Small Stones:** Find five small stones and write each of the people on your list onto each of the stones and place them by your bed or on your desk as a reminder to pray.
3. **Business Prayer Card or Bookmark:** Grab a piece of card that will easily fit inside your wallet, purse or book and write your list of five names.
4. **Prayer Alerts:** Add your list of five people to the alerts section of your phone
5. **Post-it Notes:** Use five post-it notes and stick them onto your mirror, above your bed or somewhere that you'll see them regularly and will be reminded to pray




